



The Host



Steve Robinson

Steve Robinson is an American radio manager, producer and executive producer. He has held senior management positions with numerous American radio stations, including WFMT and the WFMT Radio Network/Chicago, WBUR/Boston, WGBH/Boston, WCRB/Boston, KPFA/Berkeley, WBGO/Newark, Vermont Public Radio and Nebraska Public Radio Network.ork. Robinson served as general manager of the statewide Nebraska Public Radio Network (1990-2000) and WFMT and the WFMT Radio Network from 2000 until October 2016.

A 50-year radio veteran, he has produced programs ranging from classical music documentaries to public affairs programs and has directed over 100 on-air pledge drives.

In 1984, he co-founded AIR, the Association of Independents in Radio, a service organization to assist independent radio producers in the United States. Robinson wrote AIR's first two successful grants from the New York State Council on the Arts and the National Endowment for the Arts. Throughout his career, Robinson has produced dozens of radio programs that have been heard throughout the world, including live broadcasts from Salzburg, Austria (on the occasion of Mozart's 250th birthday); Durbin, South Africa (for the world premiere for the opera, "Princess Magogo); Quebec City, Canada (for a live broadcast of Mahler's Symphony of a Thousand with 1000 performers); Jerusalem, Israel (for a broadcast from the Jerusalem International Chamber Music Festival); and has produced numerous live broadcasts from Chicago and throughout the U.S. He has worked with William Schuman, Elliott Carter,[14] Charles Dodge,[15] Roger Reynolds, Alan Hovhaness and other composers on programs about their music. In 2003, he created the daily classical music appreciation radio program, Exploring Music with Bill McGlaughlin. The series is carried by state networks throughout the world including Australia and China. At the WFMT Radio Network he created the first classical music radio exchange between the United States and China.

In 2000, Robinson became the general manager of WFMT and the WFMT Radio Network. Founded in 1951, WFMT is considered as one of the most admired classical music stations in the U.S. and under his leadership many new programs were added to the local schedule, including Introductions, Impromptu and others. Robinson worked on diversifying the programs of WFMT by expanding the amount of live broadcasting from the station.

One of his most important initiatives at the WFMT Radio Network was the creation of Exploring Music with Bill McGlaughlin, in 2003. This daily, one-hour music appreciation program is heard on over 60 U.S. stations and has a weekly audience of over 400,000 unique listeners. The program is also heard in Australia, Guam, the Philippines and in Beijing. Initial funding for Exploring Music was provided by the National Endowment for the Arts with additional funding from individuals and foundations.

The station under his leadership focused on live music by broadcasting a wide array of local Chicago groups and ensembles. In 2007, the Chicago Tribune named him "Chicagoan of the Year" in the arts.

In 2015, he executed a cross-cultural broadcast relationship between America and China by exporting to China for the first time broadcasting concerts by the NY Philharmonic, LA Philharmonic, San Francisco Symphony, Dallas Symphony, Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall. He also arranged for concerts from the Shanghai Spring International Music Festival and the Shanghai Symphony Orchestra to be exported to the West with broadcasts in the U.S., Canada and Europe.

In 2004 and again in 2010, Robinson created and produced two, live, 17-hour fundraising campaigns involving all Chicago radio and TV stations to aid victims of the tsunami in southeast and the earthquake in Haiti. Each campaign raised over \$3 million. Robinson received two Wesbury Award from the American Red Cross of Greater Chicago for the fundraising campaigns.

In 2008, Robinson and Bill McGlaughlin received the Dushkin Award for Exploring Music with Bill McGlaughlin from the Music Institute of Chicago. He has received local and national awards for his work in Chicago, including the Champion Award from the Merit School of Music, the ASCAP/Deems Taylor Award for creative programming and others.

James Adler AdlerOaks Music Library

James Adler is a pianist who "can create whatever type of music he wants at the keyboard" (Chicago Sun-Times) and a composer who writes "with uncommon imagination" (Atlanta Journal-Constitution). He has been commissioned by the Curtis Institute of Music to compose a work as part of the Curtis Centenary Commissioning Initiative "100x100". Mr. Adler will compose a work for solo piano to be performed and recorded by him in 2023, marking the 50th anniversary of Mr. Adler's graduation from Curtis.

In April, Mr. Adler returns to the Arts on Bergen midday concert series at Saint Peter's University, where he will premiere a new work by Henco Espag: Mistieke Feetjies, composed for and dedicated to him. Throughout the season, Mr. Adler will be recording his theater and art songs at the Yamaha Artist Services Piano Salon for a forthcoming release by Albany Records. The release also features Mr. Adler's latest work, "Hope" is the thing with feathers (poetry by Emily Dickinson).

He recently joined the Sound Espressivo Advisory Board. Sound Espressivo - Virtual Classical/Jazz music is known for the competitions and events it hosts. For the 2022-23 concert season, they will be introducing auditions to compete for an in-person concerto appearance at Carnegie Hall, New York City, as well as with orchestras around the world, in addition to offering online Virtual Concert Halls concerts and events. The James Adler Audience Favorite Award is presented at Carnegie Hall during the Laureates Gala.

Mr. Adler made his orchestral performing debut with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra and has appeared in recital on the Orchestra's Allied Arts Piano Series, and the Dame Myra Hess Memorial Concerts Series. His appearances have brought him from Chicago's Grant Park, to London's Royal Albert Hall (broadcast by the BBC), to Thessaloniki, Greece, to New York's Alice Tully Hall, Symphony Space, and the Paramount Theatre at Madison Square Garden.

His extensive list of compositions is headed by Memento mori: An AIDS Requiem. Performed worldwide, recorded by AmorArtis Chorale and Orchestra, and published by Alfred Music, Memento mori features a "range of expression [that] is expansive" and is "a unique, well-crafted, emotionally rich piece" (American Record Guide). Other compositions include Reflections upon a September morn (poetry by Walt Whitman); Songs of Innocence and of Experience with poetry by William Blake; A Winter Triptych (recorded by the choir of Judson Memorial Church, Henco Espag, music director); Monday's Child, performed at The Cathedral of Saint John the Divine and at The Metropolitan Museum of Art; Daughters of Music (lyric by Debra Rue), commissioned by Sigma Alpha lota International Music Fraternity Fort Worth Alumnae Chapter and performed at the SAI National Convention in 2018; Carols of Splendour, premiered at Carnegie Hall ("A cheerful, splashy tour de force, skillfully constructed and full of clever ideas," The Choral Journal); It's Gotta Be America, commissioned for the Centennial Celebration of the Statue of Liberty; FANFARE XL for symphonic band, written for the 40th anniversary of The Lesbian & Gay Big Apple Corps; Elegy and Impromptu for Oboe and Piano (commissioned and premiered by Ian Shafer); and Canticle For Peace, written for the opening of the 43rd session of the United Nations General Assembly (published by Colla Voce Music). Mr. Adler is also the composer of Concerto in G for Piano and Orchestra (published by Alfred Music and distributed by Luck's Music Library), the children's "pOpera" Herbie and Carnie: A Dinosaga, the Classic Rag-time Suite for orchestra, numerous solo, chamber, and choral works, and the award-winning film score for The Hat Act. As performer and composer, Mr. Adler can be heard on recordings from Albany Records, Capstone, Navona, and Ravello Records. He is a member of the Department of Fine Arts at Saint Peter's University, a National Arts Associate in the Sigma Alpha lota International Music Fraternity and was selected in 2018 for membership in the SAI Composer's Bureau. James Adler is a recipient of the 2017 Marquis Lifetime Achievement Award.

The New York Chamber Players



The New York Chamber Players is a Professional Chamber Orchestra of 42 players . It is dedicated to producing performances of mostly classical music. About 2/3 of the Orchestra is core and the remaining 1/3 is new at every production chosen through regular auditions: in NYC there is a wealth of talented musicians and we want to give the opportunity to all deserving professionals . The Artistic Director welcomes professionals from all nationalities and races as a reflection of the true spirit of New York City . Our main mission is to promote live classical music through presentations of classical music to contemporary audiences, using different formats to enliven and inspire musical experiences. The formats include spontaneous communication with the audiences, unusual in most concert settings, as well as full awareness of proper alternative visual effects such as alternative lightings (inserted sometimes during the performance of contemporary or modern music) and / or insertion of dancers that can enrich the communication especially during the performance of contemporary music. The organization will fulfill its mission by :

- enhancing the career and musical activity of its artists, mostly young professionals who have graduated from colleges, universities and conservatories.
- promoting classical music to contemporary audiences.
- expanding beyond traditional presentation (musicians in tuxedos, on a stage, silent except while playing music)
- giving particular attention to contemporary music and lesser known but great composers.

The Maestro







Maestro Giacomo Franci is the Artistic Director and the Conductor of The New York Chamber Players, an organization he founded in 2004. For the 2010-11 season Maestro Franci was elected Guest Maestro of Escuela de Direccion de Orquesta in Cordoba, Spain.

Giacomo Franci is world renowned as the leading interpreter of the music of Aaron Copland. He earned this highly coveted position based on the merits of his acclaimed world premiere recording "The Complete Edited Piano Works by A. Copland", a triple CD released by Fone' Classics. Maestro Franci performed at Alice Tully Hall, Lincoln Center, for the centennial of Copland's birthday in February 2000, receiving rave reviews for his performance.

In December 2010, his World Premiere Recording "Igor Stravinsky: The Complete Published Piano Works" was released by Fone' Classics. The double CD recording was praised by Audio Review Magazine as "...the Great Igor Stravinsky in the outstanding performance by Giacomo Franci." In 2016 he started the Recordings of The Complete Piano Sonatas by Beethoven on Sheva Collection Record Company, this year (2020) he has in program the 3rd CD Recording. In 1998 Franci debuted at the Carnegie Recital Hall and the Italian Music Magazine "Musica" compared him to Glenn Gould and Arturo Benedetti Michelangeli. Mr. Franci hails from Tuscany and now resides in New York City. When not performing he works at The Tribeca Music Studio, a teaching studio for aspiring pianists and singers.

Maestro Franci started his Concert Career in Italy with appearances at Teatro Comunale "Guglielmi", Teatro San Filippo di Torino, Circolo della Musica di Bologna, and Teatro Comunale di Ferrara. When Franci is not performing as a featured pianist/soloist he devotes his time to conducting his new chamber orchestra. He is very excited about the recent attention which he and the orchestra are receiving. The chamber orchestra had their debut at the CAMI Concert Hall in New York City in May 2004, performing the Bach Piano Concerto in D minor, and they have been in growing demand ever since. Franci who is constantly looking to interpret new works, studied with Gaetano Gaeta and Giampiero Semeraro while earning his Bachelor's Degree in Piano from the Boccherini Music Institute in Lucca, Italy. He was awarded his Master's Scholarship from the Scuola di Alto Perfezionamento Musicale in Saluzzo, Italy, studying with Jean Fassinat and the famed Aldo Ciccolini. He also studied conducting with Piero Bellugi and Gustav Kuhn at Teatro Comunale di Pisa. Over the last few seasons Franci has been a featured soloist for engagements throughout the USA, Italy, England, Finland, France, Bulgaria, Chile, Turkey, China, Hungary. He is a returning soloist with: Philharmonic Orchestra of Veneto, Orchestra Sinfonica di Grosseto (where he has been featured as Soloist/Conductor), La Grande Ronde Symphony Orchestra, ISO Symphony, Turkey State Symphony in Istanbul, Richmond County Orchestra, New York Chamber Players, Orchestra da Camera Fiorentina, Bacau Philharmonic Orchestra, Ensemble Orchestral de Bordeaux and The Beijing Symphony Orchestra (where he has been featured as Soloist/Conductor). Since the year 2004 when he founded his Orchestra in New York, he has conducted many great Orchestras such as: The Shanghai Baroque Chamber Orchestra, Orchestra Sinfonica di Grosseto, Beijing Symphony Orchestra, New York Chamber Players, Concepcion Symphony Orchestra, Orchestra dei Pomeriggi Musicali di Milano, Orchestra Modigliani, Boston Chamber Orchestra in Tanglewood and Richmond County Orchestra. Very recently he has been featured in 2 Radio Programs by David Dubal: "Piano Matters" on WWFM Radio and "Reflections from the Keyboard" on WQXR. These radio programs feature the most legendary pianists of today and of all times. He has also appeared on radio and television aired by New York One, ABC, WPIX, Manhattan Cable, Hofstra University Radio, Blusat Radio 2000 (an hour long interview broadcast to an audience of over 2 million people) and Antenna 3. In 2008 Maestro Franci was selected to the Cambridge Who's Who Registry which lists the most accomplished professionals in the U.S.

Lorenzo Meo



Italy

Lorenzo Meo is an Italian pianist and composer, currently living in Zurich, Switzerland. He made his debut concerto appearances performing the Rachmaninov Second Piano Concerto and Mozart's Piano Concerto K.491 in 2002. Since then Lorenzo has made several significant appearances, performing with ensembles such as the Milano Classica Orchestra, the Orchestra of Teatro Comunale in Bologna, the Chioggia Symphony Orchestra, the Bologna Conservatory Orchestra and the Zarlino Orchestra, the New York Chamber Players in prestigious Italian venues such as the Auditorium Parco della Musica in Rome, Teatro delle Muse in Ancona, Teatro Comunale in Bologna, Teatro Comunale in Modena, Teatro Comunale in Ferrara, Teatro Flavio Vespasiano in Rieti, Auditorium Giovanni Arvedi in Cremona, Teatro della Fortuna in Fano, Auditorium del Carmine in Parma, Fairmount Auditorium in Kiev, Mystetskyi Arsenal in Kiev, Plivka Dovzhenko Center in Kiev, National Philharmonic in Lviv, Liederkranz Hall in New York.

Actively engaged in the performance of contemporary music, Lorenzo Meo regularly premieres works written expressly for and dedicated to him. As a particularly renowned interpreter of Estonian composer Jaan Rääts, he recorded his piano works for the albums "Boundaries" (2005) and "The E.P.M. Project" (2009). As a renowned contemporary music interpreter, he was invited to perform in the closing concert event for the New Music Festival at the International Art Arsenal in Kiev in 2012, playing the piano music of Jaan Rääts and Erkki-Sven Tüür. In 2015 he performed at Lviv National Philarmonic with a program entirely dedicated to new music for piano solo by women composers. In 2016 he performed the Italian premiere of Concert for Piano and Orchestra No.2 Op.70 and No.3 Op.83 by Jaan Rääts followed by the USA premiere in New York City. His discography includes, beside the previously mentioned compositions of Jaan Rääts, recordings of works by Hilding Rosenberg, Erkki-Sven Tüür, Arnold Schoenberg, and Toru Takemitsu, alongside several recordings of works of 21st Century Composers.

As a chamber musician he performed with various ensembles and interpreters. From 2000 to 2005, he played in an acclaimed duo with violist Antonello Farulli. His activity with electroacoustic composer Luigi Pizzaleo has been of particular interest, ranging over a wide variety of productions for piano and live electronics, from 20th Century repertoire to improvisation and multimedia projects. Since 2014 he regularly plays in duo with the violinist Anastasiya Petryshak, the repertoire ranging from the classical period to the 21st century and including pieces of contemporary music expressly dedicated to the duo.

"This brilliant pianist can create incredible excitement and knows how to please the crowd," the Washington Post reported in a review of Rachmaninoff's Third Concerto performed by Alexander Peskanov and the Richmond Symphony Orchestra at the Kennedy Center. Peskanov American debut as an orchestral soloist was with the National Symphony Orchestra conducted by Mstislav Rostropovich, and since then he has appeared internationally with orchestras such as the London Symphony Orchestra, SABC Symphony Orchestra, Cape Town Symphony Orchestra, English Chamber Orchestra, Polish Chamber Philharmonic orchestra, Czech Janacek Chamber Orchestra and Hong Kong Philharmonic Orchestra, and in the United States with orchestras in Baltimore, St. Louis, Houston, Salt Lake City, Richmond and many other cities. Over the years, Alexander has performed with concerts in Central and South America, including with the national orchestras of Colombia, Venezuela, Costa Rica and Guatemala. Mr. Peskanov has participated in many prestigious international music festivals, including Grant Park in Chicago, Wolf Trap in Washington, Aspen, Colorado, Newport, Rhode Island, Seattle, Vancouver, Canada, Monterrey, Mexico, Sarasota, NY and Flagstaff, Arizona and many other locations. He also frequently performs in piano recitals throughout the United States, including Avery Fisher Hall, Lincoln Center as part of the series "Russian Splendor," in New York, Kennedy Center in Washington, the prestigious Van Cliburn series at Fort Worthy. Texas and Gina Bachauer of the Salt Lake City, Utah Festival Series of Pianists In the past few years, Peskanov performed Tchaikovsky's First Concerto at the opening of the International Music Festival in Sopot, Poland and was also invited to perform a solo program at the Rachmaninoff Hall of the Moscow Conservatory in honor of the 90th anniversary of Leonid Kogan, where he awarded some of his solo works. Among the renowned musicians with whom he has had the opportunity to collaborate are Maurice André, Jean-Pierre Rampal and Yo-Yo Ma. Alexander Peskanov is also a successful composer of classical works, including piano solos, flute and piano, concertos for piano, saxophone, trumpet and chamber music. He has written twenty Piano Concertos, two of which, Concerto No. 1 for Piano and Strings and the Spring Concerto for Piano and Orchestra, were selected by the National Federation of Music Clubs for 2016-2024. Peskanov Music Festival at Medellin, Colombia in early June of 2023 will feature 120 young pianists performing exclusively Peskanov compositions, including his 18 piano concertos, numerous piano solos, duets and trios for six hands. In recent seasons, the premieres of Azery Rhapsody for Piano and Orchestra and Spring Concerto at Carnegie Weill Hall (New York) and London, England. Premieres of Alexander Peskanov piano concerts were also held in Moscow and St. Petersburg (Russia), Tallinn (Estonia), Baku (Azerbaijan), Vancouver (Canada), Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide (Australia), Cape Town, Durban and Pretoria (South Africa), Friedberg, Germany, Hong Kong, Taiwan, Malaysia, Thailand and Bogota, Colombia. Recently, Peskanov piano concertos have also received international acclaim and have premiered in Europe, Asia, South America and Africa, including the premiere of his Concerto No. 2 (Ukrainian Concert) in Mexico at the Zacatecas International Music Festival. Peskanov four concertos (nos. 1, 4, 6 and 10) were broadcasted and performed by young soloists of the Tallinn Chamber Orchestra on Estonian National Radio. His new publications include 13 piano trios, 5 piano concertos, as well as a concerto for saxophone and concerto for trumpet. Alexander Peskanov is the founder of the BMTG Intercontinental Piano Competition - Music of Immortal and Living Composers whose winners perform in New York at Carnegie Hall. He is currently the President of the Brooklyn Guild of Music Teachers. Alexander Peskanov has received three special awards from the American Union of Composers (ASKEP). His recordings include a CD of his piano compositions entitled Spirits of the Winds - Peskanov Plays Peskanov, which was broadcast on satellite broadcasts on all American national radio stations. Other recordings include music by Mozart, Beethoven, Brahms, Liszt and Scott Joplin. He recorded the music. for the American series Naxos Classic. Alexander Peskanov graduated from the Stolyarsky School of Music in Odessa, Ukraine, and received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the Juilliard School in New York. He is also the author of a six-book series titled "Russian Technical Mode for Piano," published by Willis Music and the founder of the popular Olympic Piano Program.



Recognized internationally for their emotional performances, Talla Rouge has been named NOLA ChamberFest's "Emerging Artists" of the year (2022-2023) by the Catalyst Quartet, has been invited to work with soloist Nobuko Imai, has been awarded first-prize winner in the Frances Walton Competition, and has been named a top prize winner in the International Anton Rubinstein Chamber Music Competition (2022-2023). Tallā Rouge will be a featured ensemble on the 2023 inaugural American Viola Society album and will make their Carnegie Hall debut in June of 2023. Aria and Lauren bring their Persian & Cajun heritage to the stage, challenging audiences' perception of the viola by breathing life into under-represented music for their under-represented instrument. As a champion of new compositions, Talla Rouge runs an international viola duo composition competition — aiming to lead a renaissance in viola duo composition. Tallā Rouge invites an open dialogue through their diverse programming that aims to encourage the redefinition of classical music in an evolving and interconnected world.

Nayoung Kim & Nayoung Lee South Korea


