Our Judges




<u>Jannis</u> Peterson

Jannis Peterson taught 32 years in the School of Music at the State University College at Fredonia, New York. Her activities there included applied piano, piano pedagogy and theory instruction as well as solo and collaborative performing. She was the first recipient of the Fredonia School of Music Outstanding Female Faculty Award sponsored by the student music fraternity Phi Mu Alpha. From 1996-99, she taught in the select New York Summer School for the Arts on the Fredonia campus, serving as chair of the theory, composition, and piano areas. Since her retirement from SUNY in 2010, she maintains a private piano studio, and continues to coach and perform with talented musicians at all levels of advancement, from Fredonia student entrance auditions to curricular recitals and master classes, and including events such as the Metropolitan Opera auditions for post graduate student young artists. A summa cum laude graduate of Washington State University with a bachelor's degree in piano performance, she received her master's degree in the same field from the University of North Texas. Former teachers include John Simms, Stefan Bardas, Claudette Sorel and Stephen Manes. A member of Phi Beta Kappa and Pi Kappa Lambda, she has served as chairman of the Fredonia chapter of the National Guild of Piano Teachers for over 30 years, and adjudicates and teaches for several organizations throughout the area.



Steven Bianch

Steven Bianchi is the Director of the Amherst School of Music, Inc., where he also teaches the piano and administers its programs. Regarded as one of Western New York's premiere music educators, Bianchi has produced numerous students who frequently have been prizewinners at regional, national and international competitions as pianists and composers. Also, many have been awarded scholarships for their university studies in music. One of his students, Charles Czarnecki, was awarded first prize at the Bartok/Kabalevsky competition, in Radford, Virginia. Another student, Dan Castellani won the Greater Buffalo Youth Orchestra Piano Competition and earned the opportunity to perform The Grieg concerto with this orchestra in the fall of 1999. In 1997, 1998, 2002 and 2004 Bianchi's students were awarded the top prize given by the Music Forum for Piano Teachers of Western New York, a scholarship for university study. After 43 years of teaching the piano, Bianchi has the rare distinction of having given more that 100,000 half hour piano lessons! As a result, he has begun to write a book devoted to piano pedagogy, which will be aimed at helping the new piano teacher acquire efficient and effective piano teaching skills quickly.



Anna Ouspenskaya

Anna Ouspenskaya is one of the most recognized performing artists of the Washington, D.C. area. In 1991 she made her first trip to the United States, winning Second Prize in the Bach International Piano Competition in Washington, DC. Since that year Anna was coming to US every year to perform and give master classes which took her to 18 states. In 1993, Ms. Ouspenskaya became a finalist at the Bach International Piano Competition in Germany. She made her first CD in with Altarus records, and her second is on its way on Ramsey records. Both CDs represent Russian music: the 1st of Rodion Shchedrin and the 2nd of Rachmaninoff and Tchaikovsky. An established chamber musician, Ms. Ouspenskaya has ince performed with principal members of the Philadelphia Orchestra, Chicago Symphony Orchestra, Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra, San Francisco Symphony, Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, National Symphony Orchestra and Kennedy Center Opera House Orchestra. Native of Yaroslavl, Russia, Anna was born to a family of professional musicians. At the age of seven she made her debut with the Yaroslavl Philharmonic playing Haydn's Piano Concerto in D Major. She graduated from the Moscow Central Music School and earned her Master degree from St. Petersburg Conservatory. Before moving to United States Ms. Ouspenskaya worked at Dudelange Conservatory in Luxembourg, also giving performances in France, Germany, Italy, Belgium and Scotland. Ms. Ouspenskaya made her Carnegie Hall debut in 1999 and Kennedy Center debut in 2002; she performed Saint-Saens Fourth Piano Concerto and Tchaikovsky's Second Piano Concerto in New York City and Washington, DC. A committed teacher, Anna holds a private studio in her home, and she is on the piano faculty of Levine School of Music in Washington, DC. Her students won numerous awards in local and state piano competitions. Anna and her Music Studio were featured in the TV show Rock Your Block.
